

ASLC Senate Meeting 9/29/11  
Attendance

CR: It is 7:04 and the meeting will come to order. We will begin with attendance. And now we will begin constituency reports with one person per class.

AC: Senior forum will be oct. 14 at 2pm.

CR: Okay, is that all?

AC: Yeah.

CR: Juniors?

NM: Next week Tuesday, somewhere in Templeton at 7 pm, Junior forum. Also I heard complaints about the understaffedness and unhelpfulness of IT, so maybe President could bring that up with the board of Trustees?

**Be it further resolved** that the advisory committee will regularly meet with members of the Bon Appétit staff, the Director of Student Activities, and two (2) Senators from the Student Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark. One of these Senators will serve as chair of the committee.

**Be it further resolved** that this committee chair will hold one (1) additional office hour in the Student Senate office to be available to students to solicit feedback for Bon Appétit.
