

Summer Housing Information

Campus housing is available on the undergraduate campus of Lewis & Clark College for single students who are registered for a summer class or workshop at the Graduate School of Education or Northwestern School of Law. The College does not have accommodations suitable for couples, families, or students under 18 years of age. Rooms must be reserved in advance by completing a Summer Housing Reservation Form.

Students must provide their own bed linen (extra long twin), towels, mattress pad, blankets, pillow, clothes hangers, study lamp and fan. Free Voice-Mail is available in each room, provided the student brings a telephone. Long distance calls may be made from residence hall rooms if the student has a long-distance carrier. Collect calls may not be accepted in the room. Cellular coverage on campus has improved with the installation of a cell tower on campus, however there are still some locations around campus where coverage is spotty. There is Ethernet connection for internet access in each student room and wireless service throughout the campus. Summer residents may receive and send mail from the campus Mail Room, open Monday - Friday 9:00am – 4:00pm. The College Bookstore is open for textbooks and sundry items, Monday - Thursday, 8:30am – 4:00pm and Friday 8:30am – 2:00pm.

Graduate Students

Campus housing is available for graduate students enrolled in coursework through the Graduate School of Education or Northwestern School of Law. Suite style residence hall rooms in which two adjoining double occupancy rooms share a bath are available for a two-night minimum beginning Sunday, May 27 through Friday, August 3, 2012. Even though the rooms are double occupancy, they are rented as single occupancy during the summer months.

Be advised that during the summer of 2012, Lewis & Clark College will conclude construction of a new 169-bed residence. While we anticipate completion by mid-July, the construction site is in close proximity to the graduate residence hall. Improvements to the courtyard area around the graduate hall including irrigation, new plantings and improved outdoor lighting, to name a few are also anticipated for the summer of 2012. If you are sensitive to the noise associated with a construction site, you might want to reconsider summer housing at the College. We anticipate the site work will begin each weekday at 7:00am and conclude at 4:30pm as allowed by City of Portland ordinance.

Suite Style Accommodation

Furnished single occupancy room (extra long twin bed, desk, desk chair, dresser, closet) and shared bathroom accommodation (tub/shower combo, toilet and two sinks) with one graduate student of the same gender. **\$24/night, no linen provided, two-night minimum.** Reservation and deposit must be received ten working days prior to the date of arrival.

Building amenities include: shared kitchen (w/stove, oven, refrigerator, microwave, sink but no cookware), card-operated laundry facilities, lounge or “living room” with television and basic cable, bike racks and wireless network. Kitchens are not stocked with cooking utensils, plates or flatware and residents are responsible for the upkeep of kitchens. Housekeeping services are provided on a daily basis for other common areas. Residents are responsible for the upkeep of their private room.

Reservations

For summer accommodation, advance reservations and a \$25 deposit are required. You may request a Housing Reservation Form by e-mailing sjb@lclark.edu or you may download it from the Campus Living [Housing Forms](#) page. Reservations must be received at least 10 working days prior to arrival and are subject to availability.

When completing a reservation form, please be careful to provide your arrival date and time as well as your expected date of departure. Since we have limited availability, assignments will be based on the information provided on your reservation form. It is not always possible to make adjustments in assignment dates. Payment in full must be received in the Office of Student & Departmental Accounts prior to your departure from campus. If you are auditing a course, full payment is required prior to your arrival.

Individual meals may be purchased on a cash basis in the main dining facility or the cash-and-carry cafeteria on the undergraduate campus and at the law school. Items are sold on a cash only basis in a la carte format.

Check-In Procedures

When you arrive, enter campus at Visitor Information, stopping at the Office of Campus Safety, prior to 11pm, to get your housing assignment, a campus identification card that will allow you access to the exterior doors of your assigned residence

hall and a room key. Payment must be paid in full in the Student & Departmental Accounts Office prior to your scheduled departure. If you are auditing a course, full payment is required prior to your arrival.
