When is it happening? When can I apply for it?

The program runs from May 19 to July 6, 2013. Applications are due in October 2012. Only a limited number will be admitted to the program.

Who can participate?

Any Lewis & Clark student following their freshman, sophomore, or junior year. Preference is given to those who have taken ENVS 160.

How much does it cost? Can I get financial aid for the program?

For Overseas Program costs, go to their website and click Cost (see Summer School, Overseas/Off-Campus Study). The summer program costs roughly half of a semester program, yet conveys twelve credits (see below), so it qualifies for College financial aid.

What credit do I get for participating?

Students will earn twelve course credits total, which can apply toward general education requirements (and ENVS requirements for majors).

What will the seven-week program focus on?

The overarching theme is Situating the Global Environment (see sge.lclark.edu). The Swaziland focus is periurban environmental health.

Where in Swaziland is the program based?

We'll primarily be in the Ezulwini Valley, located between the two main cities of Mbabane and Manzini, with weekend cultural and ecological trips throughout the country. The program also includes a five-day excursion to nearby Kruger National Park in South Africa.

How will we get ready for the program?

There will be a mandatory orientation throughout spring semester 2013.
