However, individuals may request an exemption related to cultural or religious ceremonies and events from other traditions. All applications must be submitted to the Associate Dean/Director of Multicultural Affairs at least 15 days prior to the event or ceremony. Applicants will be notified in writing via electronic mail (unless otherwise requested) whether the request for exemption is granted or denied. Completion of this form does NOT guarantee the individual or organization will receive an exemption.
