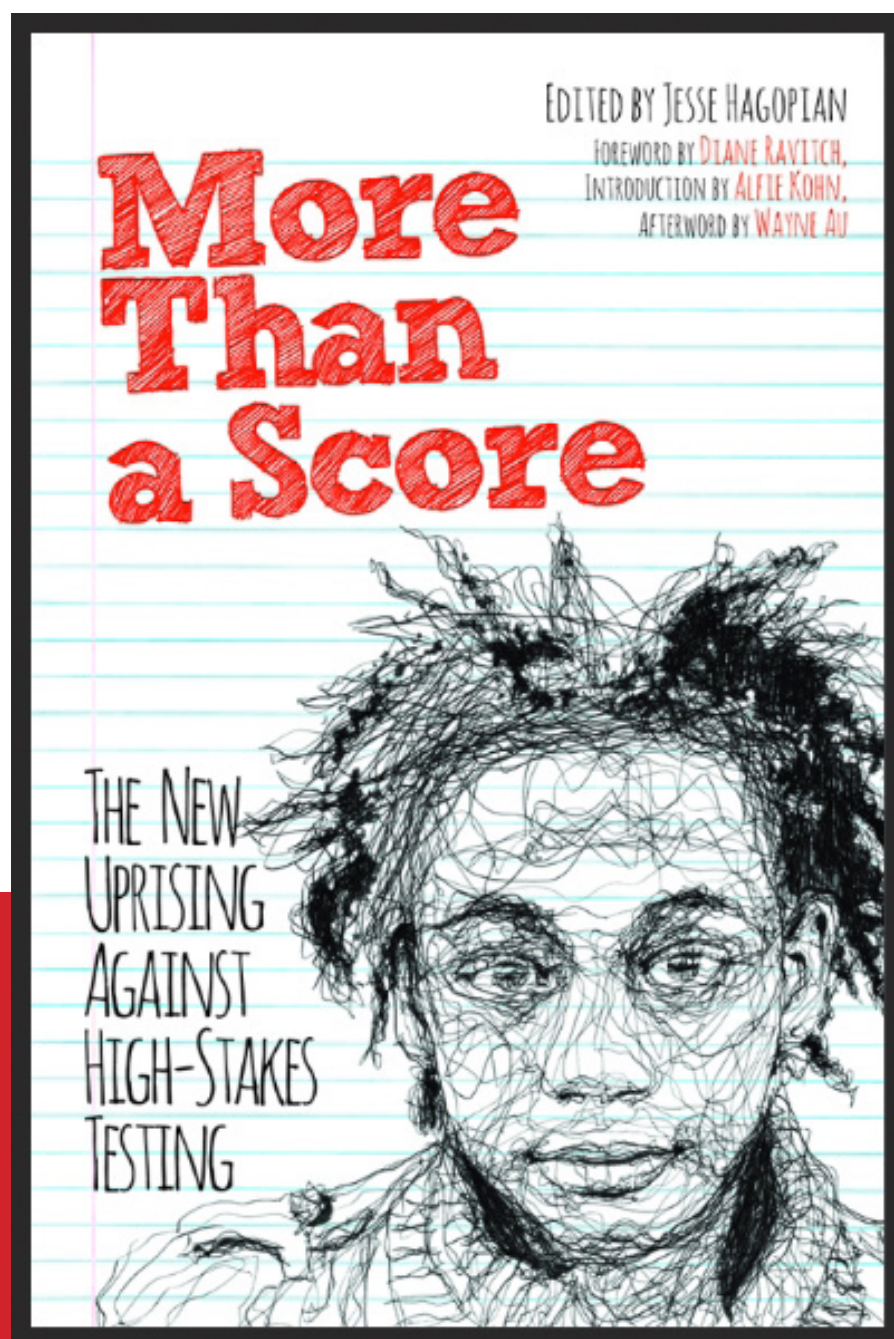


Join us for a follow-up event to the 12th Annual Ray Warren Symposium on Race and Ethnic Studies, Lewis & Clark College
