Classes begin September 5, 2017. The position is for one year with a possible extension for a second year. Duties include teaching five semester-long courses. A Masters Degree in Mathematics and evidence of excellence in teaching are required. A Ph.D. in Mathematics is preferred.

Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Please include: (1) a letter of application which includes a statement of teaching philosophy, how the applicant's teaching at the College will contribute to a culture of inclusion and campus diversity and outlines your teaching experience; (2) a curriculum vitae; and (3) graduate transcripts. Please have two letters of recommendation sent, at least one of which addresses teaching effectiveness.
