# China Concentration (24 additional credits)

- CHIN 202 or higher
- 4 credits from the Asian Studies curriculum.
  Department may approve the use of one course from outside the approved AS
  Curriculum when it contributes to thesis preparation.
- 16 additional credits of which at least 8 must be at the 300 level or higher. The credits must include at least:
  - 12 credits chosen from the China concentration
  - 4 credits chosen from the Asian Studies curriculum outside the China concentration.

Language courses above 310 may be used to satisfy the requirements.

# Japan Concentration (24 additional credits)

- JAPN 202 or higher
- 4 credits from the Asian Studies curriculum.
  Department may approve the use of one course from outside the approved AS Curriculum when it contributes to thesis preparation.
- 16 additional credits of which at least 8 must be at the 300 level or higher. The credits must include at least:
  - o 12 credits chosen from the Japan concentration
  - 4 credits chosen from the Asian Studies curriculum outside the Japan concentration.

Language courses above 310 may be used to satisfy the requirements.

# General Asia Concentration (24 additional credits)

• 24 credits chosen from Asian Studies curriculum (excluding language courses). At least 8 credits from Asian Studies curriculum must be at the 300 level or higher. Department may approve the use of one course from outside the concentration when it contributes to thesis preparation.

Language courses will not be applied to the General Asia Concentration.
