

Culturally Engaging Campus Climates Survey
Highlights for CAS Department Chair
September 20, 2018

REPORT SUMMARY

The Culturally Engaging Campus Climates Survey was distributed to all current undergraduate students, graduate students, and faculty at Lewis & Clark in fall 2016, and re-launched in spring 2017.

The CAS student survey (N= 2,023) received 357 respondents with a 17.6% response rate.

The CAS faculty survey (N= 250) received 80 respondents with a 32% response rate.




