

Conditions of Transfer Admission

Your admission to Lewis & Clark is contingent upon satisfactory completion of all coursework for the current academic year at your current level of performance.

Enrollment Deposit

A nonrefundable enrollment deposit of \$500 is required from all students who intend to enroll at Lewis & Clark College. The postmark deadline for this deposit and the enclosed **Now It's Your Turn Form** is **11:59 p.m. Pacific time on Saturday, June 1, 2019**. The **Now It's Your Turn Form** may be submitted online at go.lclark.edu/admitted.

Once you've sent your deposit, you should withdraw your application from any other colleges.

Financial Assistance

You have been considered for merit-based scholarships. If you are being offered a merit-based scholarship, you will find that information in this packet. Merit-based scholarship offers are final.

If you filed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the College Board's CSS/Financial Aid Profile by our priority filing date of March 1, 2019, or within one week of submitting your application for admission, you will be considered for need-based aid. You will receive an email when your award is ready for viewing through your Pioneer Portal.

Offers of need-based aid may be estimated. Estimated awards require additional documentation to finalize. Check your award letter to determine if your award is estimated and what further action is required. An estimated award can be finalized only after you provide the documents we require to verify information submitted on the aid applications. If the information you submit differs from the information on which the estimated need-based aid award was based, there may be a change in the type or amount of aid we are able to offer. You must submit requested documentation as soon as possible to receive a finalized award offer prior to your enrollment deposit deadline.

Financial aid funds cannot be disbursed to your student account until we receive an official final high school transcript showing date of graduation. If you did not graduate from high school, we must receive your GED or other state-recognized high school equivalency before your financial aid will be disbursed. If you did not already provide this official documentation with your application for admission, you must submit it as soon as possible.

Credit for Prior Coursework and/or Examinations

To have any college coursework taken while in high school evaluated for possible transfer credit, please provide the following: (1) A letter from your high school stating that the college work (specified by course) was **not** required for high school graduation and (2) an official transcript from the college granting credit for the course.

To receive credit for Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) examination results, please send an official report directly to the Office of the Registrar (MSC 108). See the online catalog for specific department policies.

Final Transcript and Verified Test Scores

You must send an updated official transcript reflecting any additional college work you've completed since your admission to Lewis & Clark directly to the Office of Admissions. The Office of the Registrar will contact you regarding changes to your transfer credit status upon receipt of your updated transcript. If you will enroll at Lewis & Clark with fewer than 28 transferable semester credits, you must also submit a **verified** record of your SAT or ACT scores if you have not already done so as part of the application process. Scores are considered verified if sent directly by the testing agency, included on your official high school transcript, or sent directly by your high school. You are exempt from having to provide verified test scores if you applied for admission via the Test-Optional Portfolio Path.

Verification of High School Diploma

We will confirm that all your high school transcripts are issued by a school with a CEEB code. If a transcript is issued by a school lacking a CEEB code, we will investigate to confirm the school is recognized by an appropriate state department of education or home school association. We may request a copy of your diploma at any point in the admission process to verify enrollment and graduation.
