Types of Recitals

SENIOR DEGREE RECITAL

If you are planning to present a recital for credit as your Senior Project, you must register for MUS 490 during the semester the recital is presented. Recitals for credit are graded by a committee of three Music Faculty members - your primary instructor, your advisor, and one additional Music Faculty member. This committee will be assigned to you. All committee members must be able to be present at your recital. You will work on the details of planning this event with the Performance Events Coordinator and your advisor.

NON-DEGREE RECITAL

Students performing a non-degree recital are required to complete the Non-Degree Recital Authorization Form. You will work closely with the Performance Events Coordinator for scheduling rehearsal and performance dates, and general event planning. You must have authorization from your Major Teacher and Faculty Advisor prior to requesting a performance date.

JOINT RECITAL

Joint recitals are permitted for non-degree recitals. Each recital student must complete a <u>Joint Recital Authorization Form</u>. You will work closely with the Performance Events Coordinator for scheduling rehearsal and performance dates, and general event planning. You must have authorization from your Major Teacher and Faculty Advisor prior to requesting a performance date.

JURIES

If you are performing a Senior Degree Recital (and upon approval from your primary instructor), you are permitted to use your recital in place of performing a jury.
