## Graduation Requirement Checklist

## By the end of the intended term of graduation, students must:

Earn at least 128 total credits
Meet all General Education requirements
> A blank line in the program evaluation means that the requirement is not complete
Complete enough credits in the department
> Students are allowed to be 1 credit (for majors which require less than 50 credits) or 2 credits (for majors which require 51-65 credits) short in the major if it the shortage is due to transfer credit or advanced standing credit being used in the major. (No credit shortage is allowed in minors.)Complete all departmental requirements
> Course Substitution forms are required for all substitutions in the major or minor; it is no longer possible to write these into the program evaluation. Students are encouraged to submit Course Substitution forms as early as possible, but they must be submitted with the graduation application at the very latest.
> Students are assigned to catalog requirements when they enter LC. If the major requirements have changed or new courses have been introduced, newer requirements or courses will need to be substituted into the program requirements as indicated above.

Have enough discrete credits between majors/minors
> Students with multiple majors or minors must complete at least $\mathbf{2 8}$ discrete credits in each major and $\mathbf{1 2}$ (or more for some minors) discrete credits in each minor
> Major/Minor combinations where students commonly fall short of these numbers: Hispanic Studies and Latin American Studies, Math and Computer Science, Physics and Math, Biology/Psychology and Neuroscience
