<u>Hillary introduces Robin Holmes-Sullivan, (new since Feb. 2019) Vice President of Student Life</u> and Dean of Students.

Presentation and Q & A - Robin Holmes-Sullivan:

Robin speaks about the vision, direction and plan for Student Life at Lewis & Clark.

The four big ideas we are working on all center around: student engagement/experience.

1. Re-imaging the student experience and engagement for the current generation.

Research shows us that when students are engaged in their academic and co-curricular experiences they do better, they graduate sooner and they retain better. Reimaging the experience taking into account the generation of students we have right now. We are working with a consulting firm on issues that students have told us are important to them and that we feel will play a role in better retention.

- Spaces where students can gather.
- Dining/Campus activities.
- Transportation.
- Communication

We are seriously analyzing and making recommendations and changes for the spaces on campus, in particular Templeton. We could make Templeton more of an intentional student center. We are also looking at Pamplin, JR Howard, and other spaces on campus with an eye toward retention and community building. In addition, we are focusing on the Dining experience and Campus activities. Our dining has some operational concerns that are causing some dissatisfaction for our students. We are looking to make changes to address this. Our overall campus activities are also hampered by the fact that students do not have a space to engage those activities. Transportation options to other areas of Portland besides downtown are going to be studied and recommendations will be made. The final focus is going to be Communication: how we communicate to students and how they want to be communicated with. We are being intentional about making the students voice be the driving force on the priorities and recommendations.

2. Creating a yearlong 1st year student experience.

We are going to take our New Student Orientation (3-4 days), the Academic Core E&D course (Full Semester) and Pioneer Success Institute (6 weeks with academic credit given) and combine it into one cohort. One cohort though this first year of programing will boost retention. 15% of 1st year students leave. For a small liberal arts college this should be 3-10%.

Also, we can do better with our 2nd, 3rd, and 4th year students, to set them up for whatever they are going to do after they graduate. We are developing a *co-curricular learning experience* that has expectations or pathways to help student gain certain competencies. Competencies that will set them up well for what they will do next in life as well as give Lewis & Clark a competitive advantage. Some of the skills we would like to address are, Leadership, Civic Engagement, Understanding of self (health and wellbeing), and abilities to work with difference or people who are different from you.

3. Healthy Campus Initiative.

We want to beef up our prevention, and making it a campus wide engagement. Both students and staff/faculty could use more healthy spaces. For example, we do not have a fitness center.

4. Student Life Staff

Budget struggles are negatively affecting staff (long hours). There is a lack of innovation and creativity, because of budgetary constraints. We want to develop formal professional development with an acknowledgment program, and opportunity pathways

President's Report –Hillary

- Topics from the last Board of Trustees meeting:
 - O Refinancing debt:

One of the things the trustees did in this last meeting was to approve refinancing some of the college's debt and borrowing an additional 35 million. This action was able to take advantage of a better interest rate and will help cover some of the costs of the capital improvements that are needed to be done on campus. The tentative plan right now is to use the money to renovate Templeton, Pamplin, Olin, and the Corbett House and to do some reconfiguration work at Huston Sports Complex. In addition, a new Dormitory will likely be built.

O Divesting from fossil fuels update:

The Trustees are continuing with the Process of divesting from fossil fuels. The Board committed to full divestment from the colleges publicly traded investment strategies before December 31, 2022.

- Enrollment was 42 students short this fall. Retention was up about 4%, which help to neutralize the lower enrollment.
- The APP budget has be reduced about 15% and we constantly evaluating what things we do are making the most impact and where we can make adjustments.
- 20% of Andrews's time is now also devoted to fundraising.

Black and Orange Parties debrief – Caroline Mead

Thursday, September 26th, 39 cities (9 international).

Our attendance has been slowly dropping over the last few years. This year we had 972 registered and 550 attended. We tried a new format in Portland and had one party in SE and one in SW. There was good feedback, and people liked that we had a party in the SE but the attendance was low and split between the two parties. About 7 years ago, our attendance rates were similar to today at 50-60%, but we could get about 1600 people to register.

Alumni Chapters signup – Andrew

Soon you all will be getting an email explaining how you can help us make calls to other colleges to find out what other schools are doing with their Alumni Chapters. We are looking at schools that are like us and are doing a better job with alumni giving and how do they run their chapters. Our Alumni participation is at 16% and we want to get that up to 18% or better.
