

Senate Bill Number SP19 SB014

A Bill to Overhaul the Elections Bylaws

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark here assembled that:

Section 1: Amend Article I, Section 1 to read:

- These bylaws establish the regulations, procedures, and structures of elections for the Director of Elections and their Committee, along with ASLC and the student body at-large,
 - a. The oversight of the aforementioned shall be the duty of the Director of Elections and the responsibility of the Chief Justice and/or Chief of Staff, as is appropriate,
 - These bylaws cannot be construed to contain any implied rules, powers, or abilities not explicitly stated,
 - The Elections Committee will be referred to here-within as Elections Committee or the Committee,

Section 2: Amend Article II, Section 2 to read:

- 2. Candidate eligibility and declaration of candidacy materials (hereafter: election packets) shall be made available starting in the first (1st) week of Fall Semester,
 - a. Eligible elections packets for Senators must include the signatures of twenty-five (25) students of the College of Arts and Sciences,
 - Elections will open within twenty-four (24) hours of the deadline set for the submission of eligibility and declaration of candidacy materials,
 - c. Elections shall be open for seven (7) days,
 - d. The dissemination of voter information pamphlets shall coincide with the announcement of open elections,
 - e. Students may also submit Senate applications outside of election periods to be considered for a Senate position in the event of a vacancy,

Section 3: Remove Article II, Section 3 Section 4: Remove Article II, Section 4

Section 5: Amend Article III, Section 2 to read:

- 2. Candidate eligibility and declaration of candidacy materials (hereafter: election packets) shall be made available starting in the eighth (8th) week of Spring Semester,
 - a. Elections will open within forty-eight (48) hours of the deadline set for the submission of eligibility and declaration of candidacy materials,
 - b. Eligible elections packets for Executive positions much include a specified number of signatures from the enrolled student body of College of Arts and Sciences, to be set as follows:
 - i. Candidates for President must have one hundred (100) signatures,
 - Candidates for Vice President must have one hundred (100) signatures,

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- iii. Candidates for Chief Justice must have one hundred (100) signatures,
- iv. Candidates for all other Executive positions must have fifty (50) signatures,
- c. Elections shall be open for seven (7) days,
- d. The dissemination of voter information pamphlets shall coincide with the announcement of open elections,

Section 6: Remove Article III, Section 3

Section 7: Remove Article IV, Section 1, Sub-section c

Section 8: Amend Article IV, Section 2, Sub-section a to read:

 Candidates may be subject to audit by the Elections Committee in which proof of purchase is required to demonstrate said candidate is within the fifty dollar (\$50.00 USD) limit,

Section 9: Remove Article IV, Section 4, Sub-section b

Section 10: Amend Article IV, Section 5 to read:

- All candidates shall be granted equal access to any and all election forums and events hosted or organized by Elections Committee.
 - a. Within the designated week of voting, Elections Committee must oversee the organization of a candidates' debate with open attendance to any and all members of the College of Arts and Sciences, and held at a time of great convenience,
 - b. The Elections Committee shall make public the time, date, and location of the aforementioned debate within the election packet,

Section 11: Amend Article IV, Section 6 to read:

- 5. Violations of these rules are subject to review and enforcement by the Committee,
 - a. Enforcement powers include, but are not limited to:
 - The removal of campaign literature and media in violation of the Elections Bylaws,
 - ii. The issuance of warnings to candidates for any violations,
 - 1. Upon the third (3rd) warning, the offending candidate shall be immediately and automatically recommended for disqualification,
 - iii. A recommendation for disqualification,
 - Any complaints about a violation of elections rules may be submitted to the Elections Committee,
 - c. The Committee must follow-up on any and all filed complaints with due diligence,
 - d. The Committee must respond to the complainants with a written or verbal affirmation of investigation and a report of the investigation's results upon its Introduced on <u>April 18, 2019</u> by <u>Senator Nick Gothard '21</u>

Section 12: Amend Article IV, Section 7 to read:

- The disqualification of a candidate from any election requires the unanimous approval of the Director of Elections, the Chief Justice, and the Chief of Staff,
 - a. In the event the Elections Committee feels an offense warrants disqualification the Director of Elections shall, within twelve (12) hours of the investigation's conclusion, submit a recommendation for disqualification and a report of their investigation to the Chief Justice and the Chief of Staff,

Section 13: Amend Article V to read:

Article V - The Elections Committee

- The Elections Committee shall see to the execution of all enumerated elections requirements within Article V of the ASLC Constitution and within the Elections Bylaws,
- 2. The Director of Elections shall act as Chief Executive of the Elections Committee,
 - a. The Director of Elections may delegate responsibilities to Associate Directors of Elections of the Committee as they see fit,
 - The Director of Elections is ultimately accountable for the fulfillment of all elections requirements and the enforcement of all regulations,
- The Director of Elections shall be responsible for initiating and overseeing applications for assistants to the office,

Section 14: Amend Article VI to read:

Article VI: Vacancies and Special Elections

- 1. Special elections are to be held as prescribed by the ASLC Constitution,
- All special elections shall follow the standard elections rules and regulations as stipulated within the ASLC Constitution and within these bylaws,
- 3. In the event of a Senate seat vacancy:
 - a. A Senate seat shall be considered vacant in the event:
 - i. A senator submits a formal resignation to the ASLC Senate,
 - ii. A senator is no longer taking courses at the College of Arts and Sciences,
 - A senator is recalled by their respective constituency as provided for within this Constitution,
 - b. In the event of the vacancies of one (1) or two (2) Senate seats,
 - The President shall notify the student body of the existence of open seats and available applications with twenty-four (24) hours unless,
 - 1. The Elections Committee unanimously votes to extend the Introduced on <u>April 18, 2019</u> by <u>Senator Nick Gothard '21</u>

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timeframe,

- ii. All applications shall be submitted to the Elections Committee,
- iii. All senators must assist the Elections Committee in circulating applications and publicizing the vacancy,
- iv. Applicants who have submitted an application earlier in the same academic year may opt to reuse that application instead of submitting a new one,
- Applicants shall present themselves to the Senate and will be elected by a plurality of the Senate,
- c. In the event of the vacancies of three (3) or more Senate seats, a Special Election is the means by which these seats are filled,
 - i. The Director of Elections will initiate a special election any time:
 - 1. Three (3) or more Senate seats are vacant,
 - 2. Excepting the recall of a Senate seat, in which case a special election is automatically initiated for one (1) vacancy,
 - ii. The Director of Elections is not required to fill three (3) or more Senate seats via Special Election if both:
 - 1. The Elections Committee (Including Director of Elections) unanimously votes to abstain from a Special Election,
 - 2. The Senate concurs with a four-fifths (4/5) majority to abstain from a Special Election,
 - In the event that a Special Election is abstained from, Elections Committee will fill the vacancies as enumerated in Article IV, subsection 1, sub-section b of these bylaws,

Section 15: Amend Article VII, Section 2 to read:

Recalls are to be initiated as prescribed by the ASLC Constitution, but further conditioned such that:

Article 16: Amend Article VII, Section 4 to read:

4. Should the CAC validate a motion to recall, the Elections Committee shall initiate a special election for the seat of the officer recalled,
