

## Senate Bill Number SP20 SB008 A Bill to Remove Rescindment of Stipends from the Constitution

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark here assembled that:

Section 1: Remove Article VI, Section 6, Subsection q:

- a. Stipends for any position may be rescinded
  - Rescission shall take place should a stipended ASLC member fail to perform or fulfill a specific duty clearly and distinctly stipulated within a provision of this Constitution or any ASLC bylaws
    - 1. Such provisions must make specific their inclusion of stipend rescission as a penalty
  - ii. Rescissions shall not take effect until the following criteria have been met
    - 1. The individual whose stipend is at stake is issued a warning that they are at risk of rescission
      - a. The President may issue this warning to members of the Cabinet
      - b. The Vice President may issue this warning to members of the Senate
      - c. The Chief Justice may issue this warning to members of the Cabinet or the Senate
    - 2. One week after the warning has been issued, the issuer of aforementioned warning may file for rescission with the Constitutional Affairs Committee if they judge that duties have continued to be neglected
    - 3. The Constitutional Affairs Committee shall have the final authority to issue a rescission upon review and a majority (>1/2) vote
  - iii. Rescinded stipends may be reinstated by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Senate for any stipended position within the ASLC
- b. All rescinded stipends shall not be paid out from the ASLC Operations Budget

Section 2: This bill shall take effect immediately.
