- ii) Lots of fundraising experience

- iv) Wants to join senate to bridge the gap between students and administration
 - (1) The gap is the biggest issue and should be the primary concern of ASLC
 - (2) Not that is is bad now but can be better

 - (1) Wants a bigger focus on community service and surrounding areas
 - (2) Wants to bridge gap between collins view neighborhood and LC

- ii) Wants to return to ASLC as she was a member of senate and several committees last year
 - (1) Came as a member of public before being elected
- iii) Focus on mental health and other health services
- iv) Wants a calendar hub for a base to advertise all events on campus
- v) Wants to be back on campus before cementing any other ideas

a) Jack for Nick:

- i) What communications issues have you encountered?
 - (1) Issue of DSA's being taken without notice
 - (a) ASLC and student body could be closer
 - (b) Wants to be more involved and connected to the administration

- (2) College Outdoors was mishandled and generally confusing
 - (a) Felt that it could have been more succinctly communicated to students timewise
- ii) Ben for Nick:
 - (1) How do you plan to address communication?
 - (a) Making sure administration knows where they went wrong and the problems that caused
 - (b) Email is not often checked but maybe implement a way to sign up for more emails for the people who want that info
- iii) Mikah for Liam:
 - (1) How would you connect LC to the Collins View neighborhood
 - (a) A project that would involve the neighborhood and the LC student body would be easier done if he can submit legislation and be involved with senate directly
- iv) For Liam
 - (1) How would you connect the community as a whole?
 - (a) New student trips are important and leads to set groups of friends in the beginning
 - (i) Athletes should be involved in these trips
 - (ii) LC diversity is a large part of athletics so opening these trips would instill more diversity and inclusion as a whole
- v) Annika for Liam
 - (1) Neighbors are concerned about students smoking on their property; has this been brought up and how would it be addressed?
