2. Announcements

3. Legislation

MM: The meat of this (SP21 SR001) is to establish a daily COVID daily email. We would then get the total death and cases in Oregon juxtaposed with the Lewis & Clark information. I was hoping we could figure out a way to make this daily COVID

email. If we all agree on this, I would like for us to discuss who to submit this to. I wanted to keep the transparency in the campus and so that we are not down playing the situation.

CA: I like that you said that it can be optional because some people could add to their anxiety. I like the idea of it because I get the daily information from the Bark and Bulletin. I like consolidating it into one email.

MM: I find that checking your email is the easiest thing to check in LC.

PC: I was wondering if it is possible to add national or oregon numbers. Maybe that might be too much work though? Maybe just some more numbers to add to the scope outside of portland?

MM: I do like the idea of moving outward. The reason I did not was because it was more for on campus students because the farthest they could go was portland. I will make a note of it for now.

TP: I think that only listing the numbers from Portland is not helpful. I think that we should also include whether it should have increased or decreased.

MM: I like that idea but I do not know how to make the automated email system.

OW: I hear the concern that these numbers need to be put into perspective. As someone who interacts with this information daily, there is not enough information

to be shared daily. As someone who interacts with emails going out to students, nobody reads any of our emails. I personally struggle with finding an email to a communication problem. Why don't we try adding it to the COVID page instead?

MM: How I am not super understanding of the communication issue, if there was a way to add the portland numbers onto the dashboard that would be good.

OW: There is a free Oregonian subscription that gives you the updates for that.

AT: If people are signing up for the email they will want to check the email and if they are expecting that regularly. Someone was mentioning whether it is going up or down and that could be more easily updated with just saying if it went up or down. Portland vs the greater area, people go off campus to the coast without permission. By having the surrounding areas that could be relevant information.

MB: There are already resources that exist, I hesitate to ask the Task Force to take on this task because they are already doing so much. I think a simpler way to add a page on our website could have resources on that. We need to make sure that we are providing emotional support from that.

LP: I agree with Mikah because there are resources out there and students can use the pre-existing resources.

MM: I wrote to add the primary emotional support. I appreciate the discussion on

MM: The dashboard has a total running number so I would want to use that. The testing number would change to reflect higher. You would get a new notification when the case increases.

CA: I like the idea that Olivia brought up about directing them to the Organian one.
