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SESSION I

Chris Ohman - Call to Order

Introductions: Peter Dempsey '01 and Marisol Jenkins '15 introduce each other to the board.

They both give self-introductions by sharing fun facts they learned about each other.

Chris Ohman - Welcomes everyone.

Chris explains the fall meeting structure: The meeting will be in two parts. Today's meeting is Part 1 and Part 2 will happen on December 6^{th} .

Chris Ohman– Introduces Bruce Suttmeier, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences

<u>Update and Q & A - Bruce Suttmeier:</u>

- Bruce gives an overview of the preparation for the fall opening and some of the challenges, as well as an update on the current CAS situation.
- Bruce spokes about how a great amount of work went in over the summer to adapt to teaching in the era of Covid. New technology is being utilized in creative ways, and measures such as outdoor classrooms have been used. This fall about 25% of classes went completely online and just under 2/3 are hybrid courses. A total of 14 courses require an in-person component. We have about 345 students who opted to go fully remote.
- Students have been doing a great job following protocols, and the good news right now is in terms of the rate of covid on campus we are doing very well. We have not had a positive case since August. The first-year students are feeling a bit less connected because there's less opportunity for that kind of social cohesion, that is important for first year students.
- Bruce highlights the work that faculty have been doing coming out of the summer on racial justice and equity. The faculty retreat at the beginning of the fall was devoted to racial justice and racial inequity at the college, both in terms of the curriculum and in terms of everything else. One of the things we wanted to do is recognize that this is work that white faculty and not faculty of color need to help organize and it's work that we need to do.
- Bruce also mentions that the college is now a part of the **Posse Foundation**. A five year partnership to expand the recruiting pool of outstanding young leaders from diverse

backgrounds, help build more interactive campus environments for people from all backgrounds, and ensure Posse Scholars take on leadership positions in the workforce upon graduation.

• Changes to the spring calendar.

There will be no fall break, which would have been October 10 or so. Instead, we gave an entire week off at Thanksgiving. Therefore, November 20 is the last day of in person classes. On November 30 when classes start up again they will be 100% online. This is to avoid students traveling and then coming back to campus, which we thought would be one of the primary ways to spread covid. We like most schools have done away with the full week of spring break. And what we've done instead is to do some two small mini breaks. At the end of February there will be a Thursday and Friday off and in March, there will be a Monday and Tuesday off.

Spring course modality numbers are similar to the fall, although about 45 courses are in-person required. There has been a lot of outreach to students about their options, and students who are currently remote or took a leave of absence have been invited back to campus. Several of those students who took a gap year, who were freshmen are starting in January. So that has been very positive that we think our good results in the fall, have made some of our more anxious students feel sufficiently confident that they're coming back to do their classes in the fall.
