On-Campus COVID Booster Vaccine Clinic, Feb. 7

Lewis & Clark's Health Service is partnering with getaflushot.com to offer an on-campus vaccine clinic in February. The new bivalent COVID booster (Pfizer) will be available at the clinic. As we continue to monitor COVID-19, guidance from the Oregon Health Authority, CDC, and World Health Organization informs us that a new Omicron subvariant XBB.1.5 will likely cause increased COVID cases in Oregon soon. Updated COVID-19 boosters help restore protection that has decreased since previous vaccination, and provide broader protection against recent variants.

To participate in the clinics, our outside vendor is requiring that you do the following:

1. Complete the following forms and bring **paper copies** to your appointment:
 - a. [COVID vaccine insurance claim and consent](#)
 - b. [COVID pre-vaccination checklist](#)
2. Plan to wait **15 minutes** after the COVID vaccine.
3. Hydrate and eat before your appointment.

It is very important that you bring your **PRINTED insurance information and consent form with you to the clinic.**

Information about the COVID Bivalent Booster

The bivalent COVID booster is safe and effective and protects against the original strain and Omicron variants. You can get either the Pfizer or Moderna COVID vaccine two months after any initial vaccine series or two months after a previous booster. There is no cost for the COVID vaccine booster.
