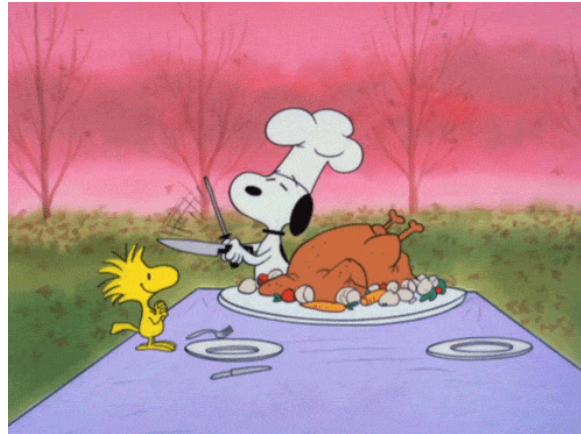




Week 12: Today is Transgender Day of Remembrance

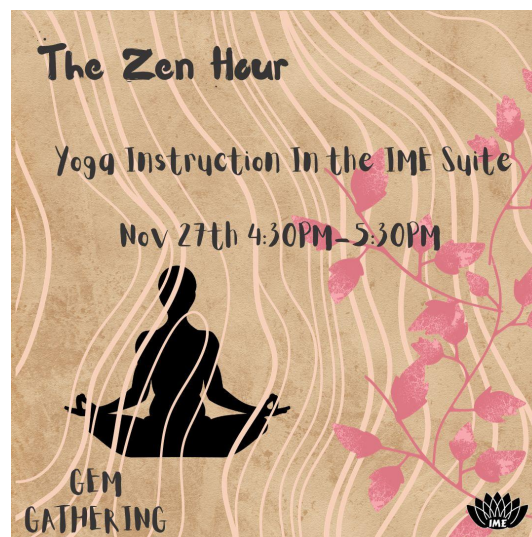

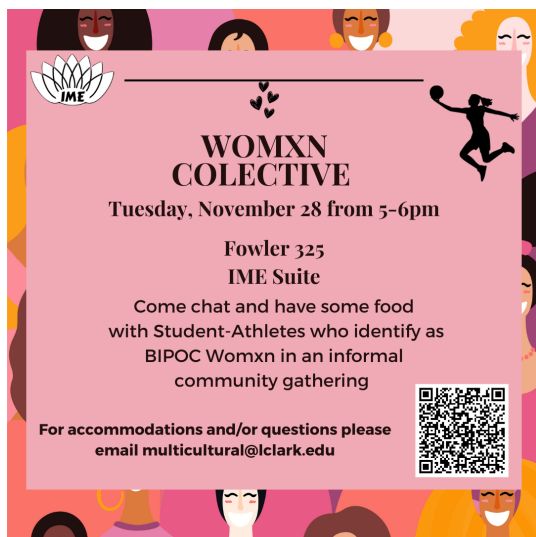


Community Circle: BIPOC Women Student-Athletes

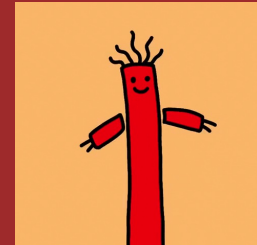

Developing Intercultural Competence

AESC 270, Spring 2024

Are you interested in increasing your ability to navigate differences more appropriately, successfully and authentically? Are you interested in developing capacity to navigate change and challenging situations? This course is designed to increase your interpersonal and communication skills for working more effectively with diverse communities.



Intercultural capacity is a continuous learning process to develop knowledge, appreciation, acceptance, and skills to be able to discern cultural patterns in your own and other cultures and be able to effectively incorporate several different worldviews into problem solving, decision making, and conflict resolution. It is also the capability to shift cultural perspective and adapt behavior to cultural commonality and difference in order to successfully accomplish cross-cultural goals. Such capability is developmental and it is learned; this course is intended to support such capability.

Throughout this course, we explore the theoretical model of the Intercultural Development Continuum, designed to explain the progression of worldview and experience of cultural difference, and align our own development, goals, and next steps in development along the continuum using the Intercultural Development Inventory. Participants will gain self-awareness around and exposure to cultural differences by examining, analyzing, and applying bridging strategies related to differences in cultural value patterns and through working with classmates from varied cultures.
