

The scholarship provides a maximum of \$5,000 a year towards tuition and fees, housing, or books and supplies. RSP provides additional support to recipients through scholar events, a growing online resource library, and other ongoing programs.

RSP is open to high school seniors, recent graduates, and current college students from Oregon or Illinois. We also award students at several partner HBCUs.






